W-9 INFORMATION

If your net sales (pre-tax, after the 25% contribution to WGNS and the Chicago Botanic Garden) exceed \$600, WGNS is required to send you a 1099 form. If you anticipate netting more than \$600 or if you are not sure, please fill out and bring an IRS W-9 form with you to check-in. If you do net more than \$600, we will need to receive your W-9 form before we can issue your check. If you submitted a W-9 form in 2022, we do not need a new one. I always find the pricing a little tricky. By VALUE I think it means what it is worth = what you would have to pay for this item in a store or in our weaver's guild sales area at the FAOF. MINIMUM BID is more of a buy it now at a good price rather than just a very low price to get the bidding going like they do in some silent auctions at charity events.
